- Established on 1 January 1999
- Independent, not-for-profit corporation (501(c)(6))
- Affiliated with the IEEE and the IEEE-SA
 Licensed to use IEEE logo and name
- Umbrella organization
 - Operational forum and support services
 - Provides legal forum, without need to incorporate



IEEE-ISTO: Industry Programs

- Each program establishes its own budget and service requirements
- Enables developers to define their unique rules and procedures to:
 - build a foundation tailored to the technology; the market; the participants; required time-frame; and the financial and human resources available
- Forum to develop standards, and to facilitate activities in support of the standard in the marketplace

- Structured to facilitate cost-effective programs to meet product schedules, and to attain market acceptance
- Support functions allow members and leadership to focus efforts on the goals

MEDICAL DEVICE COMMUNICATIONS INDUSTRY GROUP A PROGRAM OF THE IEEE INDUSTRY STANDARDS AND TECHNOLOGY ORGANIZATION

- 1st industry group organized within IEEE-ISTO
- Formed to accelerate, promote, and support the activities of the IEEE 1073 (Medical Information Bus) Standards Committee, and market and position the capabilities of standardized data communications.

The Printer Working Group, a program of the IEEE Industry Standards and Technology Organization, will be able to....

- Maintain its unique identity and flexibility in direction and actions
- Operate under its current rules and procedures
- Maintain complete control of its budget and operational expenses (low organization overhead)
- Accommodate unique IP procedures
- Legally exist

- Gain recognition through affiliation with the IEEE
- Publish and distribute its standards as "IEEE-ISTO Printer Working Group Standards"
- Operate w/o risk associated with unincorporated assoc.
- Utilize resources on an as needed basis

- Associated Costs and Proposed Role
 - Funding model based on fees for services provided to industry groups
 - "Formation fee" waived for PWG
 - IEEE-ISTO to provide necessary resources to transition the program
 - Initial proposal to provide meeting planning and coordination for PWG



- Meeting Planning and Coordination
 - Hotel arrangements, contract negotiation and management, payment processing
 - Coordinate pre-registration and meeting counts
 - Processing of registration fees (credit card and/or check) and distribution of invoices as necessary
 - Coordinate the PWG "ping" list
 - Distribute meeting announcements and reminder notices
- Costs \$1,000 per meeting plus direct costs of hotel



- Potential IEEE-ISTO secretariat services
 - Transition the PWG web site and e-mail lists to the IEEE-ISTO for admin. and maintenance
 - Coordination of press releases
 - Publication, distribution, and archiving of PWG's current and future standards
 - Other support services as needed by the PWG
- Costs associated to be provided after detailed review of needs and requirements
